FIELD OF APPLICATION

Use of mouth and nose cover (so called community masks)

The mouth-nose cover is not a personal protective equipment. It serves as a mechanical barrier for possible exhalation of the coronavirus SARS CoV-2 and thus protects the persons to whom you will possibly come too close (external protection).

The Federal Institute for Drugs and Medical Devices (BfArM) describes the effect as follows (Quote, translated version)

Users of the "community masks" described above cannot rely on these masks to protect them or others against the transmission of SARS-CoV-2, as no corresponding protective effect has been demonstrated for these masks. Despite these restrictions, suitable masks as clothing can help to reduce the speed of respiratory flow or droplet emission, e.g. when coughing and visibly supporting the awareness of "social distancing" and health-related careful treatment of oneself and others. In this way, they or their carriers can contribute to reducing the further spread of SARS-CoV-2.
